Disclosure of Information on Lead-Based Paint and/or Lead-Based Paint Hazards

Lead-based paint might be present in homes constructed before 1978. If not handled appropriately, lead from paint, paint chips, and dust can pose health risks. Little children and expectant mothers are particularly vulnerable to the effects of lead exposure. Lessors are required to declare the presence of known lead-based paint and/or lead-based paint dangers in a property built before 1978 before renting it out.

A pamphlet on preventing lead poisoning that has received federal approval must also be given to lessees.
